Quick Start Guide





Thank you for purchasing the iGuitar. USB!

If you are using a Mac with Garageband or Logic, you are ready to go! Connect a standard USB cable from the guitar to your computer, go to System Preferences, and select iGuitar. USB as your input device. Then, go to application preferences and select iGuitar. USB as your input device.

The Mac is a self-contained music system and the audio input and output devices are built into the Operating System. This means that getting music into and out of the Mac is as easy as plugging in.

If you are using a Windows PC, you will need to have low latency ASIO software installed with your audio software. Go to Control Panels, and select iGuitar. USB as your input device.

The PC doesn't have built in audio software. This means that in order to produce music on a PC, you need to install audio input and output software. There are many different software applications available.

Q: What are the system requirements?

A: Mac running OS 10.3 or better, Windows XP.

Q: What does the iGuitar.USB do?

A: The iGuitar.USB has a built in digital audio processor that allows you to plug your guitar directly into your computer for audio recording applications, eliminating the need for an external audio interface.

Q: Can I plug the iGuitar. USB into a regular amp?

A: Yes, the guitar still has a normal 1/4" output jack.

Q: Does the iGuitar.USB control software instruments?

A: Yes, if you want to control software instruments, you'll need to get an iGuitar.USB model that also has the 13 pin output to use with the Roland GI-20.
